## RATIONALE AND BACKGROUND

Since the 1990s, global and regional economic landscapes changed extensively. Consequently, in 2006 the Asian Development Bank (ADB) saw the need to revisit its fragmented Regional Cooperation and Integration (RCI) efforts—mainly in addressing poverty in the region, and came up with a more coherent and strategically focused approach to address RCI-related issues relating to cross-border infrastructure and related software, trade and investment, monetary and financial cooperation, and regional public goods. This was complemented in 2008 by RCI targets under ADB's Strategy 2020. To review ADB's RCI efforts, in March 2012, ADB organized its first Conference on RCI in Kunming, People's Republic of China.

To further analyze the changing global economic trends in the context of ADB's efforts under Strategy 2020, ADB conducted its medium-term review (MTR) of the strategy. The MTR indicated that the recent global economic environment and the region's current socio-economic conditions have focused attention on the path that RCI needs to take on structural reforms, over and above national efforts, to support productivity growth, reduce inequality, and mitigate vulnerability risks in the region.

Given the complexities of productivity, inequality and vulnerability issues in the context of RCI, as discussed in the MTR, special attention must be given to each on a sequential basis rather than all three at once. Hence, building from the success of the Kunming Conference, ADB is organizing a series of roundtable conferences to define the future RCI agenda based on analytical studies on RCI-related factors contributing to sustained, equitable, and efficient economic growth and development in the region.

In this Conference, six major background papers on RCI and Productivity will be presented and discussed in separate sessions, which will attempt to address, among others, the following key questions:

- What role will RCI play in driving productivity and reducing inequality?
- What role can regional financing mechanisms play in promoting productivity growth?
- Why has trade not driven sustainable economic development in many of the region's landlocked developing countries (LLDCs) and fragile and conflict affected states (FCAS)?
   Based on case studies of Timor-Leste, Mongolia and Afghanistan, how can RCI better support countries' efforts to link into the international economy?
- Based on the Cambodia and Malaysia case studies, how can RCI help middle income and high income aspirants in the context of RCI-productivity-inequality nexus?
- What RCI instruments (i.e. special economic zones, information and technology) business and government can pursue to attract investment & technology?
- What are the opportunities and challenges of enhanced cooperation and integration between South Asia and Southeast Asia and beyond?

This Conference, which serves as the first of a series of discussions on the future RCI agenda, brings ADB's developing member countries, RCI experts and practitioners in various sectors, to share their views and inputs on the productivity challenges faced by the region. Based upon the understanding of these challenges, the Conference hopes to derive a number of policy implications on RCI that will ultimately focus on people's welfare. These will be translated into ADB's first ever RCI operational plan in 2015 to help address the future RCI agenda.
