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

Continued strong real growth...




In 2007:

- US\$ 4.7 billion




...relatively stable sectoral distribution...






...accounting for a fifth of total ODA...




...that is additional...








...and Asia received the most



Note: in addition, US\$ 1.8 billion was allocated to country/region-unspecified programmes in 2007




Top 20 recipients in the region in 2007






...majority in South & Central Asia






Viet Nam & Indonesia get the most...






...accounting for 80% of AfT to ASEAN






Aid for Trade from different angles






Aid for Trade as share of sector allocable ODA





Six donors provide 90% of Aid for Trade








Fiscal Deficits and ODA Performance
