


SASEC Overview

- Bangladesh, Bhutan, India, Maldives, Myanmar, Nepal, Sri Lanka
- SASEC goal "to increase trade and economic cooperation within South Asia, create linkages to East and Southeast Asia, and promote sustained and inclusive economic growth through regional cooperation"
- 46 investment projects worth over \$9 billion
- 69 TA projects worth over \$65 million
- 4 sectors: transport, energy, trade facilitation, economic corridor development
- ADB serves as SASEC Secretariat




Connecting through Corridors





SASEC Operational Plan



- First 10-year comprehensive long-term plan
- 4 sectors: 220+ priority projects: \$120+ billion
 - SASEC Vision overarching framework and long-term strategy to support sustained and inclusive growth in SASEC member countries



Transport Sector



- Enhancing multimodal transport linkages road, rail, maritime, inland water transportation
- Improving access, reducing congestion at border crossings, ports
- Improving logistics infrastructure



Trade Facilitation Sector



- Customs measures, land- and sea-based
- Border and inland facilities, improved logistics, port processes, automation
- Through transport
- Improved operations of other border agencies, SPS/ TBT measures, NSW




Energy Sector



- Improve energy trade infrastructure
- Develop bilateral and regional power markets (long-term goal)
- Promote low-carbon alternatives, energy efficiency and conservation measures

South Asia: TF Issues and Challenges

- Intra-regional trade share in SASEC countries 4.5% of region's total trade in 2015
- High transaction costs, poor logistics performance, too many nontariff barriers, cumbersome Customs procedures
- Limited automation of Customs systems
- Inadequate cross-border facilities
- Lack of effective transit arrangements
- Limited mechanisms for providing information to the private sector
- Physical remoteness from ports and access to global trading hubs
- Strengthening cooperation between governments to create efficient and integrated border management arrangements, including single-window systems



SASEC Trade Facilitation Program (2012-2015)

- Bangladesh, Bhutan, Nepal \$48 million
- Accession to the RKC by all countries; amended RKCcompliant national legislations
- Web-based Customs management systems launched/ongoing
- Reduced import/export trade document management, simplified release, automated procedures
- NSW piloted /under development / pre-feasibility study
- trade information portals; client service centers
 - Japan Fund for Poverty Reduction TAs










Cross-border Facilities

- Ongoing SASEC road projects include components to improve border infrastructure –
 - Bangladesh (2012) Improvement of land ports in Benapole and in Burimari
 - Bhutan (2014) Mini-dry port in Phuentsholing and Alay land custom station
 - Bhutan (2016) Procurement and installment of trade facilitation and logistics equipment
- Study on coordinated development of border infrastructure at select border points

Transport Facilitation

- Motor Vehicle Agreement (MVA) finalized and signed by Bangladesh, Bhutan, India, and Nepal (BBIN)
- Draft Protocol on movement of passenger vehicles substantively agreed; cargo trials conducted
- Draft MVA finalized by India, Myanmar, and Thailand
- Collaboration with UNESCAP in use of electronic tracking for transport and transit facilitation
