



What is CAREC?


Partnership among Countries and MIs

Results

• Outputs (as of end-2011)

- 4,000 km of roads and 2,240 km of railways improved
- AFG, KGZ, TAJ signed transport facilitation agreement
- Increased power generation capacity and interconnection
- Central Asia regional power master plan
- Joint customs control and customs modernization
- Officials trained to prepare for WTO accession

Outcomes

- 13-fold increase in intraregional trade (2001-2008)
- 4x increase in total exports (2001-2010) (CAREC-9)
