

Yoichi Nemoto is Director of ASEAN+3 Macroeconomic Research Office (AMRO).

Dr Nemoto first assumed the position of Counsellor at AMRO between May 2011 and May 2012, where he contributed to the work of establishing the organisation and building up AMRO's surveillance capacity. Dr Nemoto succeeded Mr Wei Benhua as Director of AMRO on 27 May 2012.

Dr Nemoto brings experiences from his 28-year career and service with the government of Japan. Prior to his appointment at AMRO, Dr Nemoto was Deputy Vice-Minister of Finance at the Ministry of Finance in Japan. Between 2004-2009, Dr Nemoto held other senior positions within the Ministry of Finance, including Director of

Regional Finance Co-operation and Director of Foreign Exchange Markets. During this time, Dr Nemoto was Chair of the Chiang Mai Initiative Working Group of ASEAN+3 countries before moving on to lead the monitoring of Japan's foreign exchange markets and management of the country's foreign reserves.

Prior to this, Dr Nemoto had served as Secretary to the Minister of Finance, Director, Office of Industrialised Countries, and Director, Office of the Vice-Minister for International Affairs.

Between 2002 and 2004, Dr Nemoto was Visiting Fellow at Princeton University's Centre of International Studies and was requested to give a speech on the ASEAN+3 Chiang Mai Initiative that was about to take shape.

Dr Nemoto graduated with a Bachelor of Laws (LL.B.) degree from the University of Tokyo and holds a Ph.D. in Public Policy from Harvard University
